Appreciating your vital support, I am writing to you today to share the news about two important milestones.


First, it is hard to believe, but 2016 marks the 25th Anniversary of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial. Dedicated on October 15, 1991, the Memorial now bears the names of 20,538 fallen heroes and serves as a richly deserved tribute to members of the policing profession. Commemorative activities and events will be held throughout the year.

Second, on January 27, we secured the tax-exempt bond financing necessary to commence construction and complete the National Law Enforcement Museum. The start of construction is set for February 29, with the Museum opening scheduled for 2018. The bond financing, along with some \$58 million in private funding made this momentous milestone possible. Your generous and loyal support was integral to our success. You did not give up on this important goal, and neither did we!

As a way of expressing my appreciation to you, I have enclosed a copy of the DVD entitled, "Heroes Behind the Badge," a powerful documentary that offers some poignant examples of the stories to be told at the National Law Enforcement Museum.
